



Favourite Things: Teaching Notes

Target Structure:	What is your favourite
Vocabulary:	General
Level:	Elementary
Time:	40 minutes
Preparation:	None

Suggested Teaching Method:

This worksheet is a great way to build your elementary students' vocabulary, as well as practise asking and answering questions about 'favourite' things.

Begin by introducing the idea of favourite things. Give an example of your own.

Before reading the text, you should set the reading task. Draw your students' attention to the four words in the box at the bottom.

2 Students can work in pairs. If necessary, demonstrate 'unscramble' on the board with a very simple sentence in the wrong order.

Go through the answers with the group.

- 8 Keep this simple by allowing students to refer to the original text. If you wish to speed this up, have students write notes for answers. However, when checking answers with a partner, demonstrate that they should use full sentences.
- This exercise helps build some common collocations your students should learn. Have them match the pairs without referring to the text. They can then go to the original text to check their answers.

Before beginning this survey, students should complete the 'You' section.

For lower-level students, go through the question form again for each of the eight topics.

Have students move around the classroom, asking and answering questions.

When the activity draws to a close, elicit some feedback.
