 - a. She lives in Canada. This is a fact.
 - b. I speak English well. *This is true.*

- c. I usually play tennis on the weekend. *This is a habit or routine.*
- d. She does not **live** in Australia. 'not' is placed before all regular verbs.
- 2. Use the **present continuous** to talk about actions happening now. Form the present continuous 'be' + 'verb~ing'.
 - a. I **am** study**ing** English. 'now' is often not used.

b. It is not raining. 'not' is placed after 'be' verb.

Overview: Students will gain confidence using the present continuous form through a variety of question and answer

activities based on clothing. The present continuous (also called present progressive) is a verb form which is used

to show that an ongoing action is happening either at the moment of speech or now in a larger sense.

3. PRACTICE ASKING QUESTIONS

- A. As a class, read the question and answer patterns a-c. Discuss and elicit examples to write on the board if necessary. You may want to review question words who, what, when, where, and why. Individually, students write questions to produce answers 1-4. Students can compare with a partner and discuss any differences or check questions as a class. Answers may vary.
 - 1. What are you eating/doing?
 - 2. Where are you sitting? What are you sitting on?
 - 3. Where are they walking? What are they doing?
 - 4. Who is she talking to?
- B. In pairs, students take turns telling their partner about the people in each picture in Part 1B. They should be able to explain what they are doing as well as what they are wearing. Model answers are provide, but answers may vary depending on how creative your students are.
 - 1. John is sitting on a park bench. He is playing a ukulele. He is wearing a hat, white sneakers, and a blue shirt.
