
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# **Giving and Receiving Presents**

### **Infinitives of Purpose** 3.

#### Α. Read the information about infinitives of purpose.

When we want to give a reason for doing or using something, we often use an infinitive (a verb in its base form with 'to' in front of it). This is called an 'infinitive of purpose'.

# **Giving and Receiving Presents**

Teaching time:	120 minutes.		
Overview:	Students read about presents/gifts people would like to receive and the reasons they want them before being introduced to infinitives of purpose. Students practice explaining why they want or do something with infinitiv of purpose through a series of written and communicative exercises.		

### 1. DISCUSS

In pairs, students describe the people in the pictures. What are they doing? What are they wearing? Students then decide on two presents each person might like and write them in the spaces provided. This is a great opportunity to practice producing the present continuous form. Elicit ideas from students and ask for reasons why.

### 2. READING

- A. As a class, students read through the words in the box. In pairs, students read about the things six people would like and fill the gaps in the text with the objects in the box. Answer any questions that arise about vocabulary. Elicit answers from student pairs.

### 3. INFINITIVES OF PURPOSE

### 4. CONVERSATION

- A. Individually or in pairs, students imagine someone gave them the 'useless' things as a present and think of two ways they could use each object using an infinitive of purpose in each sentence. Students can compare their answers with a partner and discuss any differences or elicit ideas from students. Answers will vary.
- B. In pairs, students ask and answer the questions. Encourage students to ask follow-up questions to continue the conversation if interesting. If time permits, students can present some information they learned about their partner to the class.
