Can you tell me about Thanksgiving? Teaching Notes

Target Structure:	Various
Vocabulary:	Holidays / Festivals
Level:	Lower-Intermediate
Time:	40 minutes
Preparation:	None

Suggested Teaching Method

Can your students talk confidently about holidays and festivals? This worksheet takes Thanksgiving as the initial topic, but moves on to other festivals. Your students will have the opportunity to discuss a festival in their country using the framework of the original conversation.

- The first exercise introduces the topic. Students can work in pairs. Go through the suggestions with the group. Don't offer factual correction at this stage, since there is information in the conversation
- Direct your students' attention to the missing words. Students can read alone, and then check in pairs. Have students practice the conversation, switching roles at the end.
- Students can work in pairs asking and answering the questions. When going through the answers, elicit a reason for the sentence being true or false.
- 4 Have the students read through the cues. Answer any vocabulary questions. The fourth box can be left empty at this stage.

Assign new pairs. Students can practice the conversation, using the cues in the spaces. Encourage students to 'read and look up' – i.e. make eye contact when speaking.

Have students reverse roles when finished.

Your Idea

Elicit some ideas for an event or festival which your students know about. Depending on the number of students, you could assign pairs, with each pair having a different festival. Both students should write answers to the questions on their sheets. Monitor, offering assistance where needed.

Students can then mingle with their classmates asking and answering questions on the different festivals.
