Suggested Teaching Method

For some students, using articles correctly is one of the hardest aspects of learning English. This worksheet gives a simple introduction to the use of articles with adjective-noun clusters, and proper nouns.

If necessary, present the target language on the board before giving out the worksheet.

The basic patterns covered are: *It's a pen. It's green. It's a green pen.* Also: *He is a doctor. His name is Jim.*

Give out the worksheet, and have students read through the rule box. Write a few examples on the board to check students' understanding.

Do the first paragraph of (A) with the group, eliciting the correct answer. Students can then work alone for this exercise. Direct them to complete A-C.

Students can then check in pairs. Go through the answers with the group.

Finally, set a time limit for students to write a paragraph about themselves. Give an example about yourself. Tell students to follow the themes used in the other three texts.

Monitor, and help students to self correct when you see errors.

Students can present their introductions to the class.
