Giving Advice: Teaching Notes

Target Structure:	Should, can, if I were you
Vocabulary:	General
Level:	Elementary to Pre-intermediate
Time:	30 – 40 minutes
Preparation:	None

Suggested Teaching Method

This is a light-hearted lesson dealing with giving advice. This lesson assumes that you have already taught the necessary structures, which may include:

- You should
- You can
- If I were you I would
- Why don't you
- Follow the instructions. If students aren't sure, point out the picture of a newspaper.
- You may wish to pre-teach some vocabulary: See another woman, Overhear, Have bad spots
 - Students should read the letters quickly and match the titles to the letters.
- Follow the instructions. Students should work in pairs or small groups for five minutes or so. Hold a short feedback session afterwards.
- Students should read the replies, and write the relevant name in the space for each reply.
- You will find out here if you students have a sense of humour. After the students have discussed this in pairs / groups, hold a short feedback slot.
- This could be done in the lesson, or set as homework.

Additional Idea: The Radio Show

Give students a few minutes to think of some problems. Ideas might include bad boyfriends, going bald, hating your job, hideous children etc. Students can perform a role-play with one person acting as a radio-show host, and the other students calling in with their problems.
