## Last Weekend: Teaching Notes

Target Structure:	Past Simple
Vocabulary:	General
Level:	Elementary
Time:	45 minutes +
Preparation:	None

#### Suggested Teaching Method

This worksheet is a great way to build you students' confidence in using the Past Simple in conversation. There is a dialogue, with an irregular verb quiz, question/answer practice and a mixing activity at the end.

- This first exercise can be used to brainstorm some leisure activities. Elicit some ideas and write them on the board.
- Pollow the instructions. Students should first read the conversation, and fill in the blanks with a word from below. After students have checked in pairs, go through the answers, and have students practice the conversation in pairs. Encourage the students to look up and make eye contact with each other when speaking.
- B Have students work alone and check in pairs. Go through the answers with the group.
- Students can work alone or in small teams. The verbs are listed in (rather subjective) groups of difficulty. Set a time limit, and go through the answers with the class. A perfect score is 40.
- Students should write true answers to the questions about their activities. When finished, assign pairs. Students should swap sheets. One student can read the question and check his/her partner's answer. When finished, the students can switch roles.

As an additional activity, you can have students cover the questions, so that they can only see the answers. Elicit the questions based on the answers.

- 6 Students should not refer to the original conversation. Go through the answers with the group.
- Demonstrate with a confident student.

To make the conversation flow more smoothly, have students write notes in the 'activities' column **<u>after</u>** they have finished each conversation.
