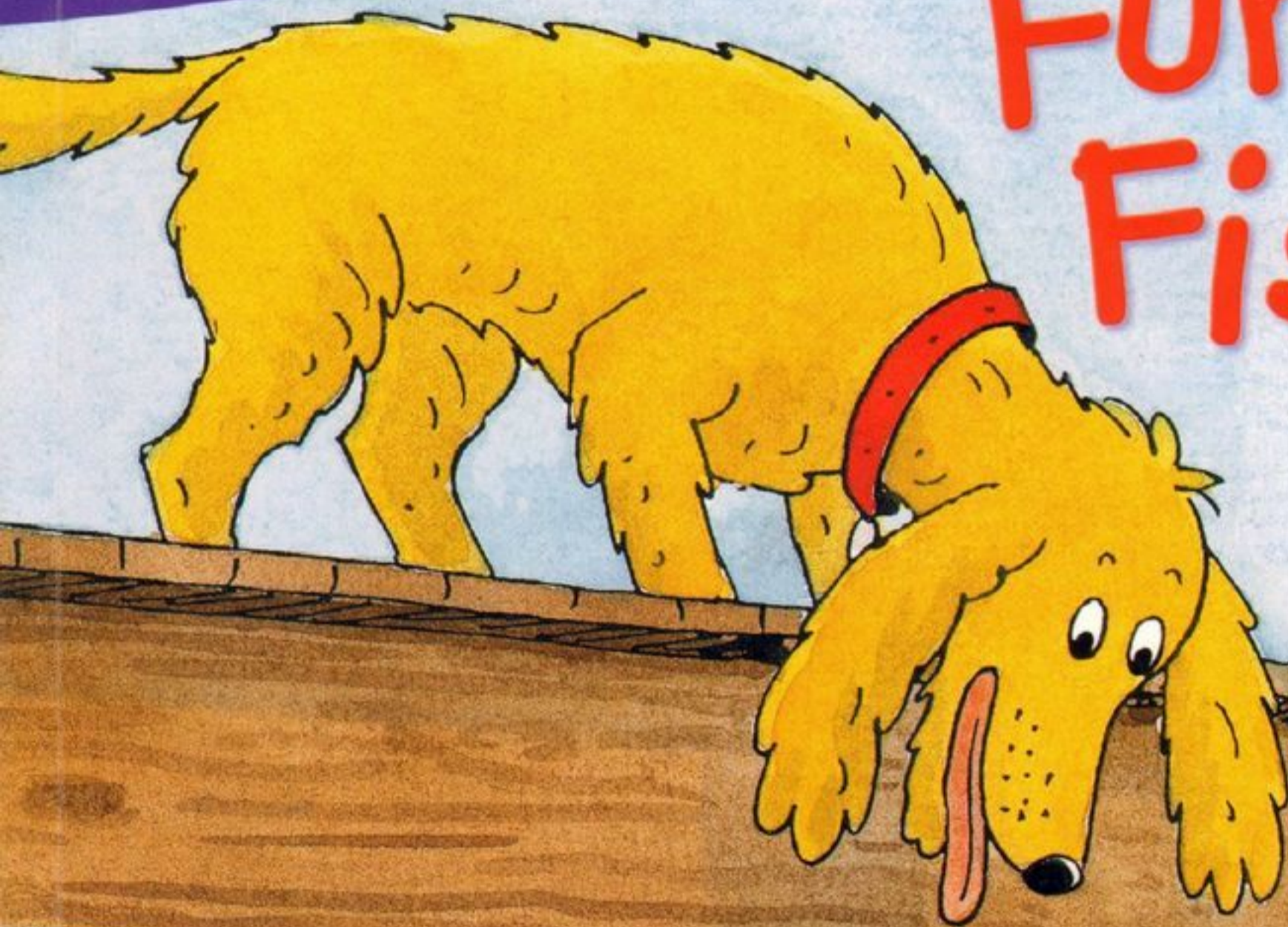

Tips for Reading Together

Children learn best when reading is fun.

- Talk about the title and the pictures on the cover.
- Look through the pictures together so your child can see what the story is about.
- Read the story to your child, placing your finger under the words as you read.
- Have fun finding the hidden starfish.
- Read the story again and encourage your child to join in.
- Give lots of praise as your child reads with you.

Children enjoy reading stories again and again.
This helps to build their confidence.

Find the starfish hidden in every picture.

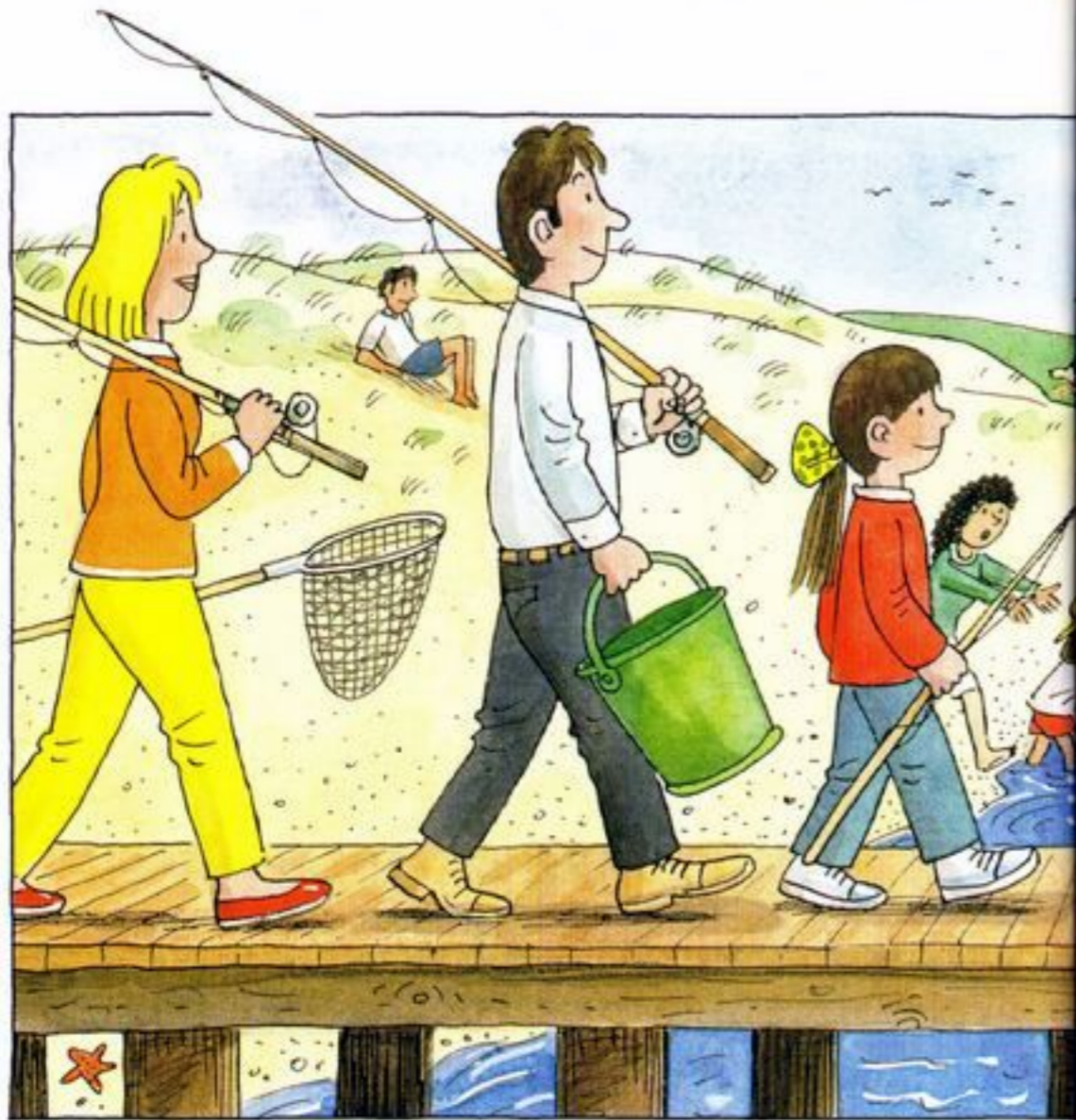

What would you do if you caught a big crab, like Biff?

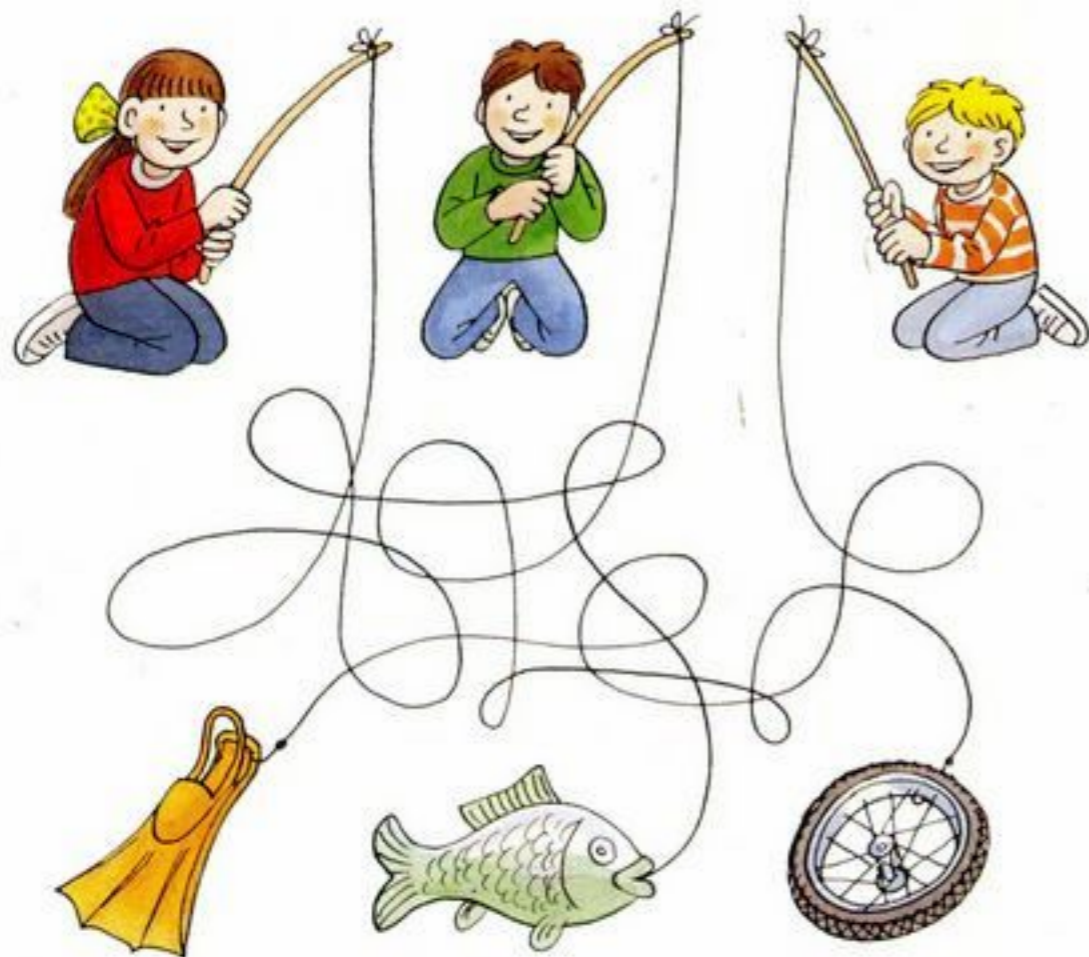

Follow the lines to see who gets the fish.

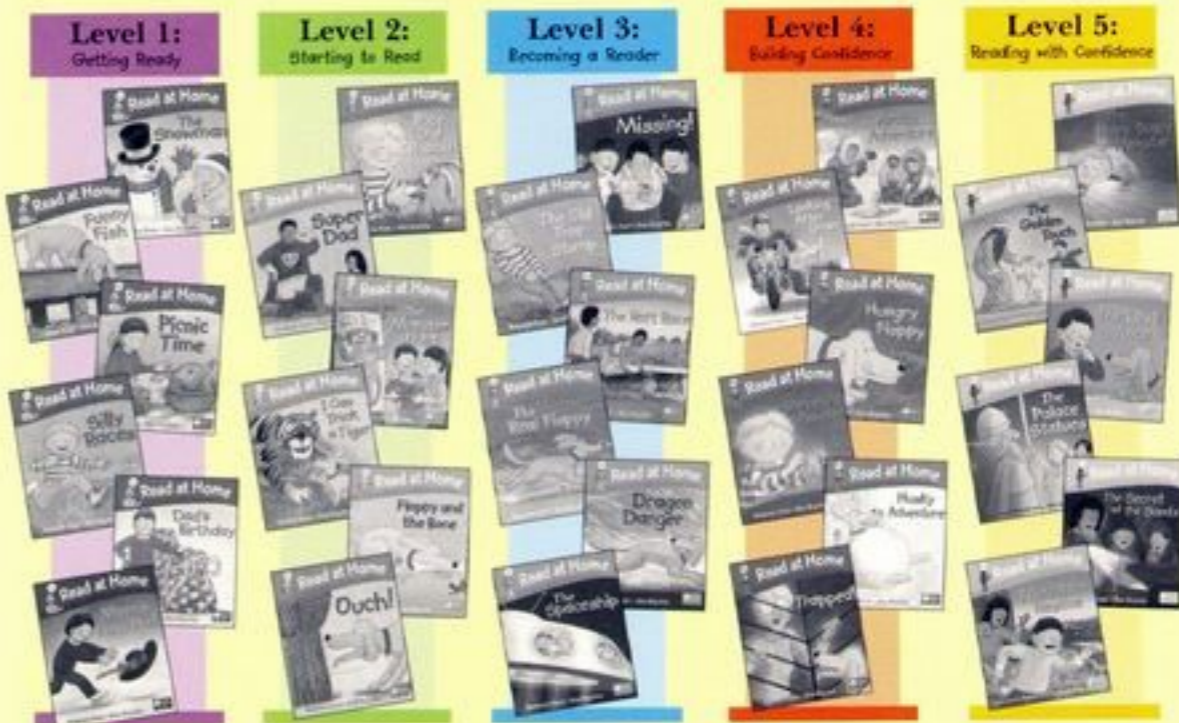

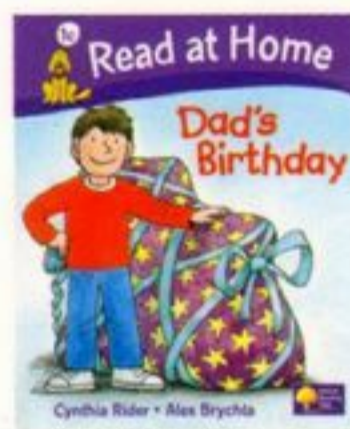
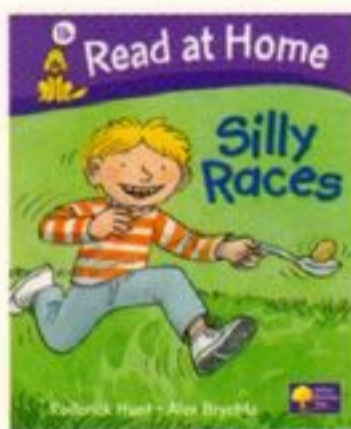
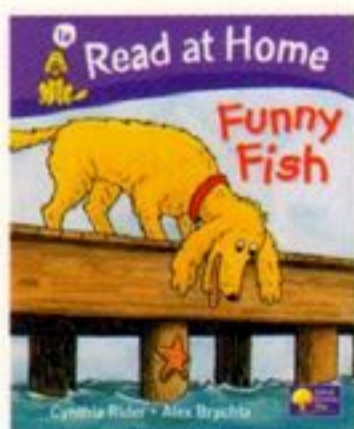


Read at Home is designed for young readers. The entertaining stories and humorous illustrations contain built-in progression and vocabulary repetition – which is just what children need to become successful readers!
